**SUBJECT : INVITATION TO ALL PROVINCIAL DEPARTMENTS TO SHARE
THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS WITH THEIR
EMPLOYEES, PUBLIC AND STATE-OWNED ENTITIES.**

1. This communique serves to make the North West provincial departments aware of the Chinese Government Scholarships, to share with their employees, the public and State-Owned Entities.
2. The Office of the Premier, through Ikatisong School of Governance is responsible for the administration of Victor Thebe Sifora Provincial Bursary Scheme as well as collaborating with the Department of Higher Education and Training by presenting Scholarship information and opportunities for mainly the youth of North West to partake in the bursary. The Office of the Premier is thus meant to make the public aware of such opportunities.
3. The Chinese Government is offering scholarships for South African students to study at Chinese institutions starting in the 2025/26 academic year. The Department of Higher Education and Training is responsible for nominations for the Chinese Government scholarship programme.

4. The scholarship is offered for undergraduate (Bachelors) and postgraduate (Masters or PhD) programmes in the identified scarce skills, as well as non-degree Chinese language studies. Bachelor's degree scholarships are taught in Chinese and will only be awarded to applicants who already have the required level of Chinese proficiency (HSK 3 or above).

6. WHO CAN APPLY?

- 6.1. Be South African citizens in good physical and mental health;
- 6.2. Be under the age of 45;
- 6.3. Hold at least a Bachelor's degree;
- 6.4. Have a minimum of 3 years' work experience. Preference is given to those with professional experience related to the chosen field of study;
- 6.5. An applicant must fall into one of the following four categories:
 - 6.5.1. A government official at the division chief level (or equivalent level) or above;
 - 6.5.2. A senior manager of an institution or enterprise;
 - 6.5.3. An administrator of a university or scientific research institution;
 - 6.5.4. Those who have relevant employment or internship experience in international organizations.
- 6.6. Must have applied to any of the participating Chinese institutions and gotten an offer letter. The pre-admission letter given by the university must contain all of the necessary information of registration, such as personal information, the admission date and major's information. It cannot contain any

information about having received or promised to receive Chinese government scholarships.

- 7.3. Availability to study in China from September 2025;
- 7.4. Demonstrated interest in China and commitment to the development of South Africa;

- 7.6. Preference will be given to postgraduate applicants
- 7.7. Applicants must meet the minimum academic requirements for entry into a similar programme at a South African university.
- 7.8. Bachelor's applicants must have HSK 4 level language certificate and be willing to study in Chinese, applications without a HSK level 4 language certificate will be automatically disqualified.

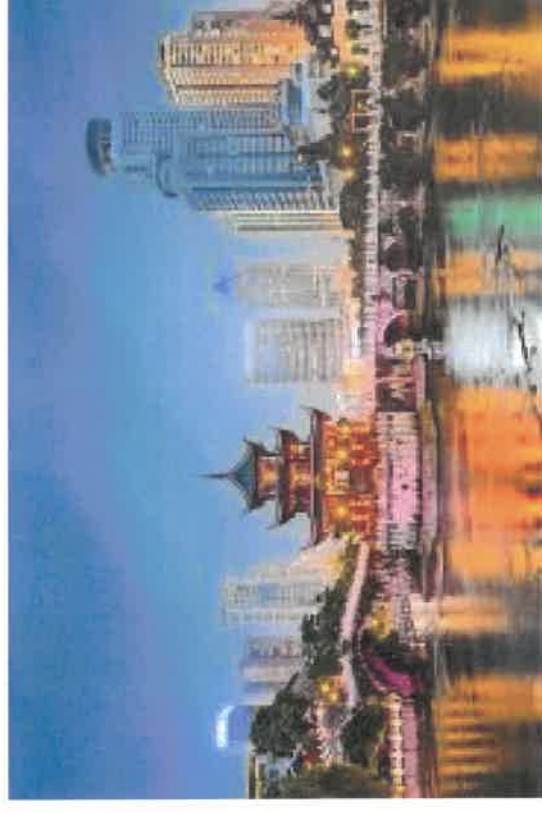

China is located in East Asia and borders the western part of the Pacific Ocean. It has a land area of more than 9.6 million square kilometers, and a mainland coastline of more than 18,000 kilometers. Its water area, including inland sea and marginal sea, is over 4.7 million square kilometers, in which there are more than 7,600 islands of every size. Among them, the island of Taiwan is the largest, with an area of 35,798 square kilometers. China borders 14 countries and is adjacent to 8 island countries on the sea. By provincial administrative division, China has 4 municipalities, 23 provinces, 5 autonomous regions and 2 special administrative regions. Its capital is Beijing. There are 56 ethnic groups in China, which is a multi-ethnic, multi-lingual, multi-dialect and multi-text country. The common language is Mandarin and standard Chinese characters.

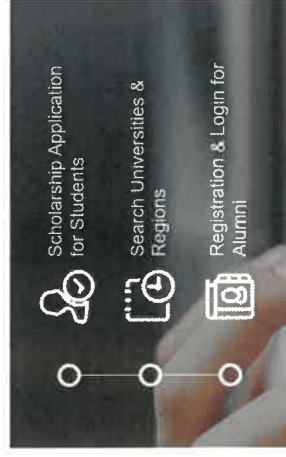

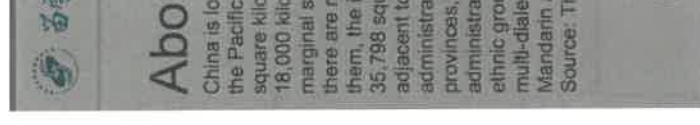

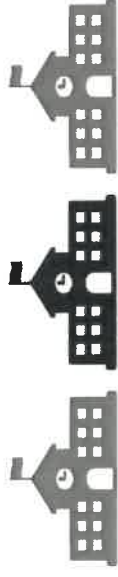

Instructions for Chinese Government Scholarship Information System (CGSIS)

Please carefully read the instructions before applying for the scholarship. Then start application by clicking "**Application Online**".

- **Step 1: Input Personal Details.** Click "**Edit Personal Details**" and finish inputting personal details by filling in all the information, verifying and saving the information. After the completion of this section, return to the previous page by clicking "Finish" and start filling in your application information.
- **Step 2: Select the correct "Program Category".**
 - **Program Category Type A** generally refers to scholarship programs responsible by authorities except Chinese universities. Applicants of Type A programs are requested to fill in the **Agency Number** of relevant agencies (e.g. Chinese Embassy in your country). Applications of Type A will be reviewed by these agencies.
 - **Program Category Type B** generally refers to scholarship programs responsible by Chinese universities under CGS-Chinese University Program. Applicants of Type B programs are requested to fill in the **Agency Number** of relevant universities. Applications of Type B will be reviewed by the applied universities.
 - **Program Category Type C** generally refers to certain appraisal scholarship programs. Applicants of Type C programs will be informed by CSC of the **Agency Number** in special notices.
- ★ Classification above only for reference. Before online application, applicant should first confirm the correct **Program Category** and **Agency Number** with the responsible agencies. Please visit the following website for introductions of various scholarship programs under CSC scheme.

- **Step 3: Input the correct Agency Number. Program Category and Agency Number** are directly matched, both are mandatory for online application. Scholarship receiving authorities (or application processing authorities) will inform the program category and agency number to candidates who are qualified for applying.

- After inputting agency number, the matched agency name will automatically show on the page. As **Program Category** and **Agency Number** are directly matched, application processing authorities will not receive your online application if the program category or agency number are not correct.
- **Step 4: Input Application Information.**
- For applicants who selected "Type A" and "Type C" application, move on to the section of "Language Proficiency and Study Plan" and upload "Supporting Documents" as requested, then click "Submit" to complete the application.
- For applicants who selected "Type B" application, click "Add a New Application" to start an application. Applicants shall complete the application by inputting the information of "Language Proficiency and Study Plan" and uploading the "Supporting Documents", until clicking "Submit".
- Check each part of your application carefully before submission. Please make sure that all the information and uploaded documents are valid and accurate.
- When applicants of "Type A" application choose the "Preferences of Institutes", system will automatically match the available universities according to the selected "Student Category, Preferred teaching language". When applicants of "Type B" and "Type C" choosing the "Discipline & Major Applying for", system will automatically match the available majors of that university according to the selected "Student Category, Preferred teaching language".

- "Catalogue of Discipline Field, First-level Discipline, Specialty" is available from the "Help", applicants could download the file to identify the relation between Discipline and Major.
- **Step 5: Once submitted, amendment cannot be made on "Personal Details" and "Application Information"**. Before the application being processed by the processing authorities, applicant can revoke the submitted application by clicking "Withdraw" and edit the application. After revoking the application, applicant must submit at second time after re-editing, or the application will not be processed. Once the application is processed, application cannot be revoked.

- **Step 6:** Click" Print the Application Form" and download the form.
- **Step 7:** Submit scholarship application under the requirements of the dispatching authorities (or application processing agency)
- China Scholarship Council never entrust any individual or intermediary agent to process Chinese government scholarship applications. Kindly remind that all applicants to directly submit your scholarship applications through official dispatching authorities, avoiding being deceived. The UJCI is proud to announce that the Basic Mandarin and Intermediate Mandarin Courses are approved as credited courses offered at the University of Johannesburg for the first semester of 2023:

1. Basic Mandarin (Qualification Code: S7011Q):

This course is designed for students with little or no Chinese language background. It aims to introduce students to the fundamentals of Mandarin language.

2. Intermediate Mandarin (Qualification Code: S7012Q):

This course is designed for students who have completed Basic Mandarin or have some prior knowledge of Chinese language and culture. The aim of this course is to introduce students to further fundamentals of Mandarin by engaging in the following aspects of the language: grammar learning, exercises of Chinese characters, and oral discourse in daily life situations.

Notice: According to UJ regulations, UJCI will organize exams for credit courses.

The final score will account for 10% of attendance, 20% of homework, 20% of mid-term exams, and 50% of final exams.

ONLINE CREDITED COURSES DURATION

- Mid-week classes :

Basic Mandarin: Two sessions a week from **13 February 2023 to 24 May 2023** (15 weeks)

Intermediate Mandarin: Two sessions a week from **14 February 2023 to 25 May 2023** (15 weeks)

HSK MANDARIN COURSES

(For ALL, include UJ students and staff)

In order to achieve the best teaching outcome, the minimum class size for each course here is 5 (If we have less than 5 students, we will notify you about the cancellation of the course when the registration is closed.

THE FOLLOWING ARE MANDARIN COURSES.

1. HSK Mandarin 1:

This course is specially designed for fresh starters who have an interest in of passing HSK certificates (The Chinese Proficiency Tests, or Chinese Standard Exams organized by Chinese Testing International Co.,Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "CTI"). Students will learn Pinyin (the Chinese phonetic system), simple characters, as well as basic grammar in this phase of preparation. This course will prepare the students to pass the first level of the Chinese Proficiency Tests, HSK 1.

2. HSK Mandarin 2:

This course is designed for students who have some prior knowledge of the Chinese language or whose proficiency level is beyond HSK 1. It will cover an introduction to the HSK exam structure, HSK 2 vocabulary lists, a range of topics covered in HSK 2, as well as grammar of the language.

3. HSK Mandarin 3:

This course is designed for students who have some prior knowledge of Chinese language or whose proficiency level is beyond HSK 2. It will cover an introduction to the HSK exam structure, HSK 3 vocabulary lists, a range of topics covered in HSK 3, as well as grammar of the language.

4. HSK Mandarin 4:

This course is designed for students who have some prior knowledge of Chinese language or whose proficiency level is beyond HSK 3. It will cover an introduction to the HSK exam structure, HSK 4 vocabulary lists, a range of topics covered in HSK 4, as well as the grammar of the language.

5. HSK Mandarin 5:

This course is designed for students who have some prior knowledge of Chinese language or whose proficiency level is beyond HSK 4. It will cover an introduction to the HSK exam structure, HSK 5 vocabulary lists, a range of topics covered in HSK 5, as well as the grammar of the language.

6. HSK Mandarin 6:

This course is designed for students who have some prior knowledge of Chinese language or whose proficiency level is beyond HSK 5. It will cover an introduction to the HSK exam structure, HSK 6 vocabulary lists, a range of topics covered in HSK 6, as well as the grammar of the language.

- 1. The HSK course provided by UJCI is only a Chinese language training, and no test is organized. If you want to take the test to obtain the official Chinese certification, please follow our platform below, and we will release the official HSK test information in time.**

In July 2014 the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Johannesburg (UJ), Prof Ihron Rensburg, signed an agreement with Nanjing Tech University and Hanban to establish a Confucius Institute at the University of Johannesburg with the hope of facilitating the acquisition of Chinese language teaching and learning and promoting the mutual understanding and exchange of Chinese and South African cultures.

The South African Government has entered into the BRICS agreement which has resulted in a number of commerce, trade, industry, science, academic, political and social agreements and exchanges. China has become an important partner to South Africa, and as a result it has become important for many South Africans, from different spheres, to learn to speak, read and write Mandarin. The UJ Confucius Institute will be offering Mandarin on different proficiency levels. Contact with Chinese colleagues, however, extends beyond language, and an understanding of Chinese culture is essential. The UJ Confucius Institute will also be offering a number of cultural courses and events to enhance a better understanding of Chinese culture. For studies in China, students must be relatively proficient in Mandarin, therefore UJ students will benefit from doing the short courses in Mandarin. Being able to communicate in Mandarin will open up opportunities for students to study in China, and given the number of MOUs and MOAs that UJ have entered into with a number of universities in China, will enable smoother communication between UJ and Chinese academics.

UJ Confucius Institute Services

UJ Confucius Institute will provide, but not be limited to, the following services:

MANDARIN COURSES

UJ CI provides Chinese language courses (primary level, middle level, advanced level, business Chinese, tourist Chinese, scientific Chinese, etc.) for UJ staff and students, primary and secondary school students in UJ's feeder areas, the general public, businesses, organizations and government departments.

CULTURE COURSES

UJ CI provides such culture courses as Chinese calligraphy, paper-cutting, Chinese chess, Chinese Tai Chi, Chinese martial arts, Chinese tea art, Chinese medicine, etc.

CULTURAL EXCHANGES

UJ CI promotes cultural exchanges between the two countries and its people by organizing different cultural events.
